



- Based on a survey of hundreds of informal settlement residents
- A place of refuge and contemplation
- A place to be private and read, sing, cry, etc
- A clean place that does not smell
- Safe to use

 Means the toilet must be private, clean, odour free, well lit and safe to access and use

Community Ablution Blocks (CABs) - interim solution



Modified Shipping Container



Design model

- one block per 50 households
- Separate showers and toilets for male and female, with handbasins
- Storeroom for cleaning materials







Design model (contd.)

- Urinal
- Washing facility for clothes



Overhead lighting for safety at night





Design advantages

- Easy to install
- Can be moved to new areas when area upgraded
